Please join us on Palm Sunday, April 14 to welcome Pastor Jed and Susan!



# **PMC ONA Committee Event April 7th**

Greetings from the PMC ONA committee. At some time in the not too distant future our congregation will be voting on the issue of announcing our ONA (Open and Affirming) status. A few weeks ago, Pastor Phil spoke to the importance of making an informed an informed decision on the issue and that the best way (the only way?) to be truly informed is to attend scheduled ONA events. I am writing to invite everyone, EVERYONE, to attend our next event on Sunday April 7<sup>th</sup> at PMC, but first I'd like to share the responses of a few of those who attended the initial ONA events.

Our first event was a viewing of the documentary "A Fish Out of Water" which addresses how the Bible addresses issues related to homosexuality. At our next event we hosted church members and clergy of UCC churches that have already declared to be ONA. As important as the valuable information provided by the film regarding Biblical content, and by those on the panel, relating first hand experiences of the process, were the comments from members of our congregation during the Q and A and discussions.

There was a general sense of appreciation for the openness of the discussion and for the knowledge that both presentations provided. There was the expression of confidence gained in the ability to discuss these issues after learning more about what the Bible has to say, and the ONA journey other congregations have made. But to me, the most significant statement was that more people needed to be present to hear the messages, to become more aware and more informed on what ONA is really all about.

So here is your opportunity. On Sunday April 7<sup>th</sup> the ONA committee is sponsoring an event which will focus on homelessness and youth and their inclusion in the concept of open and affirming. We anticipate our discussion to be led by representatives from Night Ministries sharing their first hand experiences in assisting the homeless, and youth in crisis. The event will begin shortly after service on the 7<sup>th</sup>. We will be serving food and refreshments (pizza anyone?). PLEASE join us for the program and the discussion to follow.

The year the eggs will be already filled with small goodies.


Please bring a basket or bag with you to collect eggs.

There will be a sign up sheet in the narthex so the Easter




