Attendance

"It's not about the numbers."

Spoken by a pastor from any church - whether attendance is good or attendance is not so good.

Truth is – in any area, it's pretty easy to gauge the vitality of a congregation by the number of folks who



are part of the worship service on Sunday morning. Fill up the sanctuary, feel the energy and the vitality; online with services and social media, feel the energy and vitality; conduct worship in a sparsely attended service - and feel the weariness and the weakness.

Most Sundays at Peace Memorial Church, we're filled with energy and vitality. The are Sundays, of course, that have less energy and vitality.

So what do we do about it all? How do we live as an energetic and vital congregation every Sunday – and all the days in between?

The most important thing to remember isn't about the numbers. It's about living out God's vision for Peace Memorial Church. It's about living out God's vision for the Church -- everywhere.

As we continue to work this summer on putting that vision, as guided by the Holy Spirit and based on the ideas we expressed in our season of visioning sessions, into a form that the whole congregation loves and lives into, we still live out the idea that we are a congregation of extravagant welcome, inclusivity, and a commitment to love and service.

And as we continue to seek God's vision, we need to be present in the community. That means joining together in Sunday worship. It means participating in other worship, social, and service events that are part of Peace Memorial Church. It also means inviting as many folks as we can to join in - in whatever way possible - our times of worship, education, prayer, praise, and fun. It means being present, as Peace Memorial Church, at events all over the community as well.

How many folks?

It's not a number. It's an attitude. When we live out God's vision, we're inviting people to experience that, too. That could mean one person, 10 people, 100 people We have a wonderful opportunity to live out God's vision and to invite lots of people to experience the church being the church.

I'm not sure who to invite.

How about this? Invite friends and neighbors who don't attend a church. Invite friends and neighbors who have told you that they don't like church. Invite friends and neighbors who said they'd attend church if it wasn't so "churchy" and judgmental. Tell them about your experience at PMC and invite them to share that experience, too. Let them know the many ways to be connected!

Then what?

Be the church. Meet and greet. Listen. Be a community that doesn't require people to get involved right away, but also doesn't stop anyone from being an important part of the community.

Love God. Love Everyone. Attend to one another.

With the hard work and determination of a group of 55 volunteers, the lumber was cut labeled and sorted then the walls were assembled individually and loaded into an 18 wheeler to be transported to the Habitat sites in Georgia where they would complete the construction! THANK YOU to all of the volunteers who helped in the build and in serving the food to keep the builders going!
