Godless Book



The book of Esther tells the story of the survival of a persecuted people

They're worried that they may not survive -- individually and as a culture.

Historically Hebrew people have experienced this threat many times

Today the Palestinian people are experiencing it.

Indigenous peoples on this

continent have experienced this.

There are many more people who live in persecution and worry for survival

- LGBTQIA+ Folks
- People who live with mental health problems
- People of color
- So many people who are part of populations marginalized by others in powerful places.
- Maybe even the church itself -- wondering if we will be able to continue into the future.

What did Esther do? She was proactive -- she took action to take charge of the future.

With God's help?

Well, the book of Esther never mentions nor alludes to God. It's a Godless book. Esther saved herself and her people.

What are we supposed to learn from that?

I can do all things through me who strengthens me?

That doesn't seem to fit into our understanding of God. Or does it?

Do we live knowing God is ever present... sements who listens hall

Do we live knowing God is ever present -- someone who listens, helps, and guides?

Or do we think we can and will save ourselves?

Children in Palestine

Defense for Children International—Palestine has just this month released <u>Targeting Childhood</u>, a new report documenting, through a series of case

studies, how since October 7, 2023 Israeli forces and settlers have been systematically and unrelentingly killing Palestinian children, in most cases using live ammunition. The report's overview states that, "On average, Israeli forces have killed a Palestinian child in the occupied West Bank, including East Jerusalem, every two days since October 7, 2023" through July 31 of this year. This frequency represents an alarming escalation of what the report names as Israel's "de facto policy of shooting to kill." What does this escalation look like in percentages? According to the report, "20% of all of the Palestinian children killed by Israeli forces and settlers in the occupied West Bank in more than two decades were killed in the last ten months."

As disciples of Jesus, peacemaker, justice seeker, and liberator, the United Church of Christ Palestine Israel Network affirms the dignity and sacredness of all people, stands against oppression and injustice, and works for peace with justice in Palestine and Israel.


