Gaza Humanitarian Snapshot #7

Humanitarian aid entering Gaza has fallen to an all-time low. CMEP, along with dozens of other humanitarian organizations, outlines the dire conditions found in Gaza in this Humanitarian

Snapshot. These include the direct targeting of aid workers and aid distribution points. Furthermore, tens of thousands of civilians are still trapped in Northern Gaza, which Israel has stated is a combat zone and will not allow aid to enter the region.

CMEP is a coalition of more than 30 national Church communions and organizations in Catholic, Orthodox, Protestant, and Evangelical traditions. They work to mobilize US Christians to embrace a holistic perspective and to be advocates of equality, human rights, security, and justice for Israelis, Palestinians, and all people of the Middle East.



Transgender Day of Remembrance

Each year on November 20 is a global day of mourning for transgender persons who have lost their lives to anti-transgender/nonbinary violence; a day to renew our commitments to

and solidarity with people of trans and nonbinary experience.

May our witness leave no doubt that the United Church of Christ stands with our transgender and nobinary neighbors near and far — and that we are keeping faith with the transgender, nonbinary and gender queer members of our church and community.


