Optimism

When we search for enlightenment, understanding can be a long time in coming because the information we absorb into our conscious minds must first be processed within the perspective of our experiences. Optimism and pessimism are both an experiential phenomenon, whether expressed as a mood, a temporary state of mind, or a continual attitude.

A gloomy viewpoint, an inclination to focus on the negative, low selfesteem, as well as a pessimistic view on what the future holds; excessive pessimism makes life miserable. High self-esteem, a cheerful attitude that tends to look at the positive aspects of a given situation, and an optimistic belief in a bright future are the aim, but excessive optimism can lead to dangerously risky behaviors. Our survival and wellness require a balance between them.

Research has linked optimism to numerous positive health outcomes, like lower risk of mood disorders and mental illness, improved physical health, and better problem-solving skills. It's not about ignoring the bad or pretending those things aren't happening. It's about taking steps to actively see the positive in a situation. Know what's in or out of our control. Identify what we can change and let go or shift how we feel about our circumstances. We tend to see adversity as something that happened for a reason; but we shouldn't rush to find some big lesson right away. Better we spend time thinking about what we want for the future rather than what didn't go right today or in the past.

We can consciously choose what we will allow into our being. Be discriminating about what we read, watch, and listen to. Acknowledge the beauty that resides around us, and see the larger picture. The way we have chosen to live is not the only way to live. We can widen our perspective by exploring other models of being of those around us and through research and discussion.

We can imagine optimism as a parallel pathway that's always right next to us. We won't have to do a lot of work to get back on that path. Just take one step.
