This will provide FOUR new homes for the Georgia Habitat for Humanity!

I am looking forward to new growth and new directions to compliment the established programs here at PMC under the direction of Pastor Kirk. I see a great future for PMC with him leading us!

I did see a significant look of surprise on Pastor Judy's face on Sunday the 28th when we "officially" recognized and honored her for getting us through the 2 year search process. Thank you to the fellowship committee for spearheading a wonderful Bruncheon (Brunch/Luncheon) featuring elegant bakery choices cream puffs, cannoli. Eclairs complimenting Pastor Judy's fav, Mediterranean cuisine. And again, a huge THANK YOU to Pastor Judy for her time as our Pastor!

And there was surprise on my face when I received the material list for this year's CREW build. I was asked by the director of Help Build Hope if we could build more than the two homes I had requested, he described them as much smaller that those we had built in previous builds, so I agreed. The material list told a slightly different story! Long story short PMC CREW built FOUR full sized homes so that four families would have a roof over their heads this winter. With the hard work and determination of a group of 55 volunteers, the lumber was cut labeled and sorted then the walls were assembled individually and loaded into an 18 wheeler to be transported to the Habitat sites in Georgia where they would complete the construction! THANK YOU to all of the volunteers who helped in the build and in serving the food to keep the builders going!













Looking forward on the PMC calendar, there are no surprises here, just more events to enjoy! September 10th is Celebration Sunday, when we highlight the activities of various committees and special interests here at PMC. Oktoberfest, fun for all on Friday October 13th, supporting PADS.
